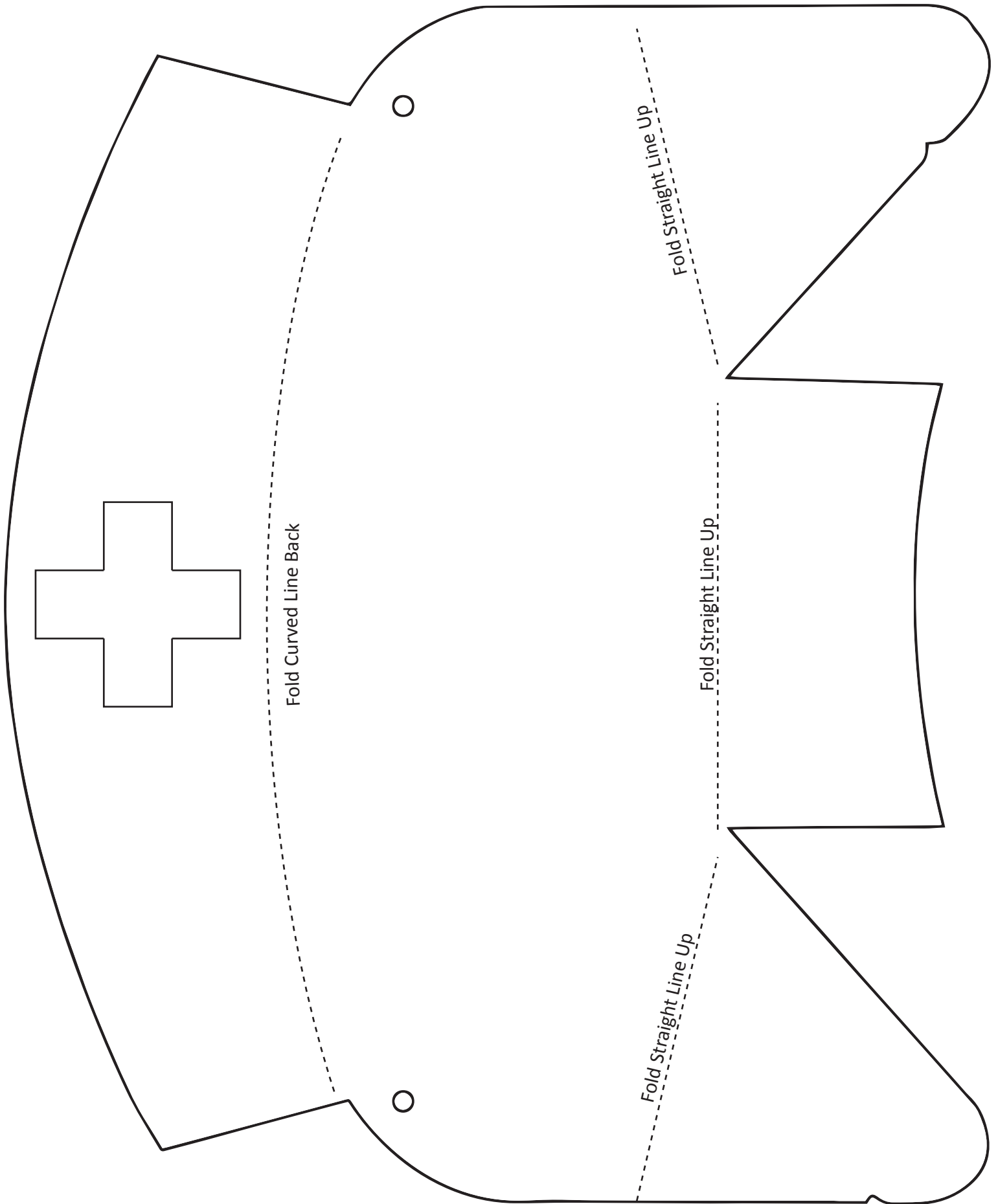

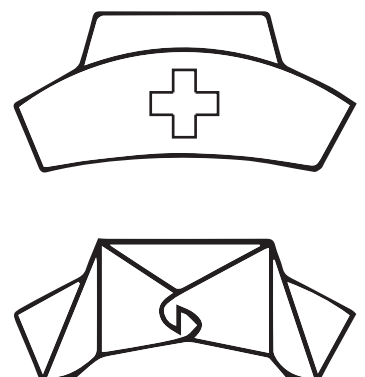


Hat Patterns - Nurse Hat (Teacher Resource 7.8)



Instructions

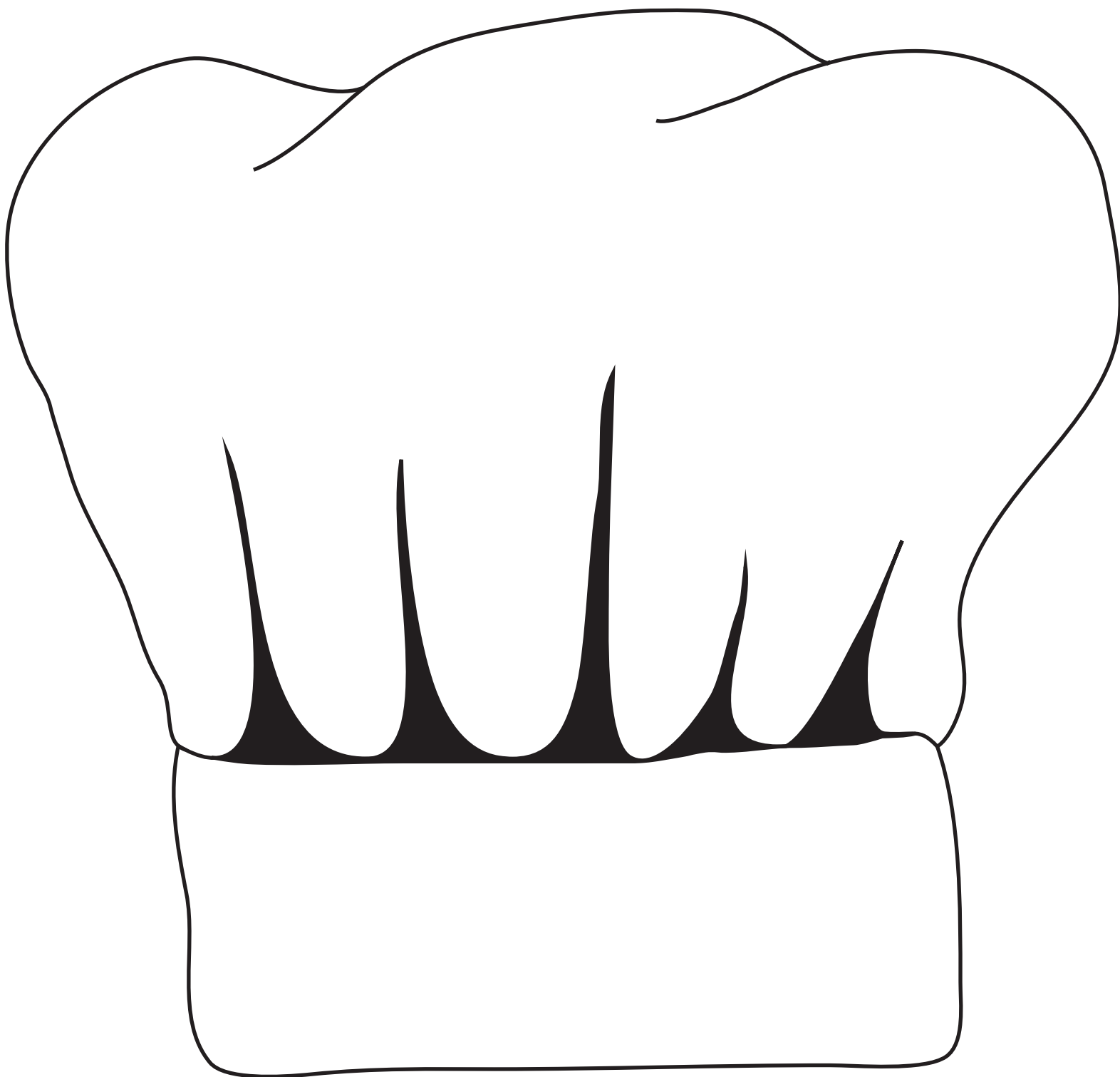
- 1) Cut out Nurse Hat pattern.
- 2) Use a hole punch to punch out the two circles on the pattern.
- 3) Fold back along the curved dotted line.
- 4) Fold all three straight dotted lines up.
- 5) Push the center of the pattern upward so that the center straight dotted line becomes the top of the hat and the two "wings" fold and clasp together in the back. The cross flap should be the front of the hat (see diagram to the right).
- 6) Use tape to secure the "wings" in place.
- 7) Use two bobby pins through the hole punches to secure the hat on the child's head.



Hat Patterns - Chef Hat (Teacher Resource 7.8)



Fastening Strip



Instructions

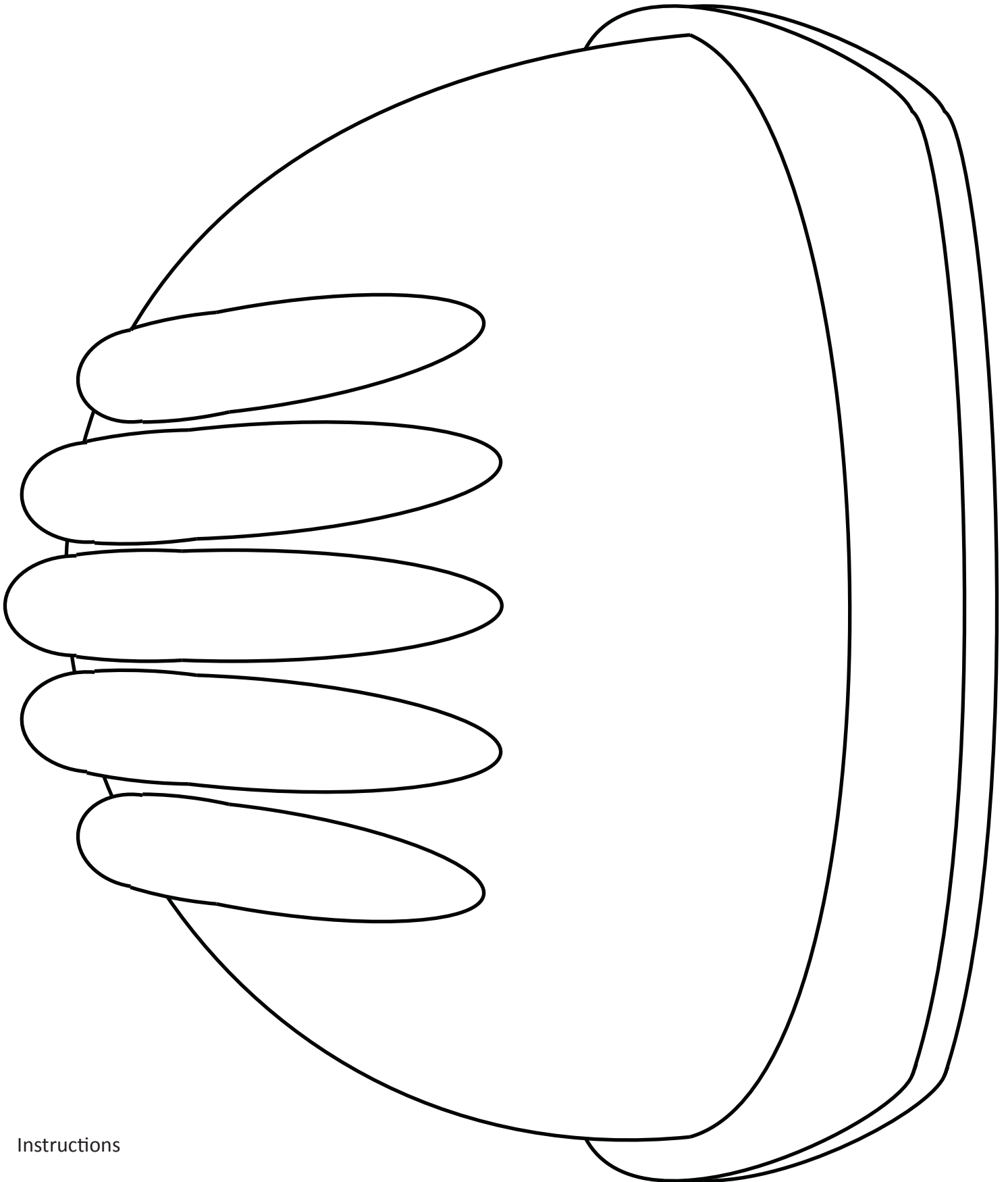
- 1) Cut out Chef Hat Pattern, Headband and Fastening Strip.
- 2) Glue or tape the bottom strip of the Chef Hat to the Headband, centering it on the marked, dotted Center line.
- 3) Tape one end of the Fastening Strip to one end of the Headband.
- 3) Place the Chef Hat on the child's forehead and wrap the Headband around the child's head. Tape the other end of the Fastening Strip to the Headband at the appropriate place where the Headband fits the child's head.



Hat Patterns - Hard Hat (Teacher Resource 7.8)

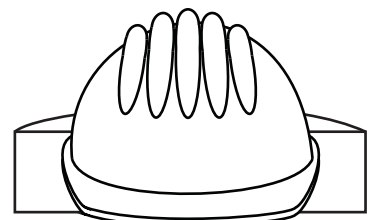


Fastening Strip



Instructions

- 1) Cut out Hard Hat Pattern, Headband and Fastening Strip.
- 2) Glue or tape the bottom strip of the Hard Hat to the Headband, centering it on the marked, dotted Center line.
- 3) Tape one end of the Fastening Strip to one end of the Headband.
- 3) Place the Hard Hat on the child's forehead and wrap the Headband around the child's head. Tape the other end of the Fastening Strip to the Headband at the appropriate place where the Headband fits the child's head.
